# Steps and Timeline for Reorganizing County, District, and State Officers in Indiana Republican Party

# 1. Reorganization of County Officers

# Timeline:

- The county reorganization must take place on the **first Saturday in March** following a presidential election year (Rule 4-7).
- The meeting must be held between **9:00 AM and 1:00 PM**. (Rule 4-7)
- County Chairmen are required to call this meeting, with notices sent out by **February 1** to all <u>eligible precinct and vice-precinct committeemen</u>, who were either elected in the May Primary of the presidential election year or appointed by **December 15** (Rule 4-7).

# Steps:

# 1. Call to Meeting:

The County Chairman is responsible for calling the reorganization meeting by **February** 1.

If the Chairman fails to call the meeting, the responsibility falls to the **Vice-Chairman**, then to the **Secretary**, and then to the **Treasurer**, or ultimately the **District Chairman** if none of the above act (Rule 4-8).

# 2. Filing Candidacies:

**Chairman** candidates must file a **written declaration of candidacy** with both the County Secretary and State Secretary at least **72 hours prior** to the meeting (Rule 4-10).

If no one files, nominations will be made from the floor during the reorganization meeting.

**Vice-Chairman, Secretary, and Treasurer**: No specific filing requirement is given for these positions.

Nominations can be taken directly from the floor during the meeting, and there is no 72-hour pre-filing rule that applies to these positions (Rule 4-10 only mentions Chairman).

"I highly recommend filing your candidacy in the same manner as the Chairman candidates and/or verifying this with your current county chair, just to be safe. While it's common for nominations for Vice-Chairman, Secretary, and Treasurer to be taken from the floor, if the County Chairman later clarifies that a 72-hour prior filing was required for these positions, having already filed will ensure you meet the requirements and avoid any issues."

#### **Election Process:**

- Voting: (Rule 4-13) The election for County officers is conducted by secret ballot, with a majority vote needed to elect each officer. The sequence for electing officers is:
  - Chairman
  - Vice-Chairman
  - Secretary
  - Treasurer
- Gender Rule: The County Chairman and Vice-Chairman must be of opposite genders. (Rule 4-13). This rule does not apply to the positions of Secretary or Treasurer.
- o If only one candidate is running for an office, the committee may suspend the secret ballot and elect the candidate by **acclamation** (unanimous agreement by voice or show of hands) (Rule 4-13).

# **Reporting Results:**

 Within 72 hours after the meeting, the County Secretary must forward the results of the elections to the State Secretary, along with required copies of the meeting minutes and sign-in sheets (Rule 4-12).

# 2. Reorganization of District Officers

# Timeline:

- District reorganization meetings are held the Second Saturday in March after the County reorganization meetings in a presidential election year (Rule 5-7).
- The meeting must be held between 9:00 AM and 1:00 PM. (Rule 5-8)

#### Steps:

# 1. Participants:

 The District Committee is composed of County Chairmen and County Vice-Chairmen from each county in the district (Rule 5-3). These members participate in the election of district-level officers.

# 2. Filing Candidacies:

 Chairman: Like the county level, candidates for District Chairman must file a written declaration of candidacy with both the District Secretary and State Secretary at least 72 hours prior to the meeting. (Rule 5-13)

- Vice-Chairman, Secretary, and Treasurer: No specific pre-filing timeline is mentioned for these positions. Nominations can be taken directly from the floor during the meeting.

# **Election Process:**

- Voting: The election for District officers follows the same secret ballot process used at the county level, requiring a majority vote to elect each officer (Rule 5-14). The officers are elected in this order:
  - District Chairman
  - **District Vice-Chairman** (Gender Rule applies, Rule 5-14, 1-17)
  - Secretary
  - Treasurer

**Gender Rule**: The **District Chairman and District Vice-Chairman** must be of opposite genders, as required by the **Gender Rule** (Rule 1-17, 5-7). This rule does not apply to the Secretary or Treasurer.

#### **Submission of Results:**

• Results of the election must be submitted to the **State Secretary immediately** after the adjournment of the meeting (Rule 5-12).

**NOTE FOR SPLIT COUNTIES:** If you are a **county that is split** between two different congressional districts, please note **Rule 5-5** of the party rules.

# **Key points:**

- In counties split between two or more congressional districts, the **County Chairman** may appoint **one male and one female district representative** after the county reorganization.
- The **County Chairman** must file the appointment notice with the **State Secretary within 72 hours** after the county reorganization. Without this filing, the representative cannot participate in the district reorganization.
- The representatives serve and vote at the pleasure of the County Chairman for the duration
  of their term, which lasts until the next county reorganization meeting unless removed
  earlier.

• If a district representative cannot attend a meeting, they can appoint a **proxy**, except for reorganization meetings or officer vacancy elections.

# 3. Reorganization of State Officers

# Timeline:

- State Committee reorganization meeting is held the second (2nd) Thursday in April following a presidential election year. (Rule 6-21)
  - (Note: 2024 RULE CHANGE This meeting used to be the on the second (2nd)
     Wednesday that falls after the second (2nd) Saturday in March following a presidential election year.)
- The meeting must be held between 9:00 AM and 1:00 PM. (Rule 6-22)

# Steps:

# Participants:

The State Committee is made up of **District Chairmen** and **District Vice-Chairmen** (Rule 6-2). These individuals vote to elect state-level officers.

# Filing Candidacies:

- Chairman: candidates for State Chairman must file a written declaration of candidacy with the State Secretary at least 72 hours prior to the meeting. (Rule 6-23)
- Vice-Chairman, Secretary, and Treasurer: No specific pre-filing timeline is mentioned for these positions.

# **Election Process:**

- Voting: The election for State officers follows a secret ballot process, requiring a majority vote for each position (Rule 6-25). The officers are elected in the following order:
  - 1. State Chairman
  - 2. State Vice-Chairman (Gender Rule applies)
  - 3. Secretary
  - 4. Treasurer

**Gender Rule**: The **State Chairman and Vice-Chairman** must be of opposite genders, according to the **Gender Rule** (Rule 6-25, 1-17). This rule does not apply to the positions of Secretary or Treasurer.

# **Eligibility Requirements for County, District, and State Officers**

# **Qualified Primary Republican:**

 All candidates for Chairman, Vice-Chairman, Secretary, and Treasurer must be Qualified Primary Republicans. This means they must have cast a Republican ballot in the two most recent primary elections in which they voted (Rule 1-24).

# **Residency Requirement:**

- o At the **County Level**, officers must be **qualified electors** of the county (Rule 4-11).
- At the **District Level**, officers must be qualified electors within the district (Rule 5-15).
- At the **State Level**, may be chosen either from the membership of the State
   Committee or from the membership of the Republican Party in the state at-large.

# No Proxies for Reorganization Elections:

 Proxies are not permitted for reorganization meetings to elect officers, ensuring that only present members cast votes for leadership positions (Rule 1-27).
